Progression Policies:

Following enrollment in junior level courses, if a student's overall GPA falls below 2.75 or the overall Nursing Major requirements GPA falls below 2.5, the student will be continued for one semester on probation. A probation contract is to be completed and submitted for approval by the Academic Advisor, Course Coordinator, and the Director of Nursing.

Any student who withdraws from or fails to complete any one of the following major courses will not be eligible to continue as a Nursing major: NU 240, 280, 310, 325, 355, 365, 375, 385, 470, 475, 485, 425, 445.

Comprehensive Examinations:

All students are required to take a national normed exam during the junior and senior year. The test completed in the senior year is considered the Senior Comprehensive Exam. Students must achieve at a pre-established score or will be required to complete an approved review program at a pre-determined level to pass senior-level clinical nursing courses.
